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Features and Functions

Extensive Client Platform Support

This equipment supports printing from IBM-compatible PC.

Various Port Options

You can map this equipment to print to an SMB, IPP, Raw TCP, WSD, or LPR port.

Multiple Job Types

Job Types refer to the way this equipment handles a print job.

- The Normal mode requires no special handling and is the most frequently used printing mode.
- Overlay File prints a document element, such as text or graphics, to a file for superimposing on the background of other documents.

Professional Finishing Options

Depending on the type of finishing units you have installed, you can choose to sort, group, fold and staple your documents (including saddle-stitching) and punch binding holes. Available functions differ from model to model.

Sophisticated Document Layout and Assembly Options

You can choose whether to print your document as you have set it up in the application, or to impose printer-driven document layout options such as printing in Book Format or printing Multiple Pages per Sheet.

Additionally, the printer drivers provide the ability to print selected pages on different media. This includes printing front and back covers, inserting sheets at predefined positions within the document, or interleaving pages so that every other page is inserted blank or printed on a different type of media.

Various Sizes of Printing Paper Available

You can define custom paper sizes other than the standard ones to print data created with your application.

Watermark and Image Overlay Support

Watermarks are a great way to subtly convey useful information about your printed documents. Common watermarks are “Confidential,” “Draft,” and “Original.” Several watermarks have been pre-defined for use with your documents, or you can create and save your own custom watermarks.

Watermarks consist of text. Image Overlays can be any combination of text, graphics or other document elements. Printing watermarks consumes fewer resources than using Image Overlays, so you should use watermarks wherever possible, particularly when printing speed is an issue.

About Installation of Printer Drivers

Printer drivers required for each OS are included in the Install Disc. For instructions on how to install them, refer to the **Software Installation Guide**.

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Before Using the Printer Driver

This manual covers all print functions of the printer drivers that are common to all Toshiba models and it explains the procedures to use them. Available printer drivers and their functions vary from model to model. This section describes the restricted print functions and options related the following models.

- e-STUDIO409P
- e-STUDIO409S

The above models support only the Universal Printer 2 (PCL6) printer driver: the Universal Printer 2 (PostScript), Universal PS3, and Universal XPS printer drivers are not supported. TopAccess is not available.

To print documents with the above models, be sure to select [Generic Model] from [Model] on the [Device Settings] tab of the Universal Printer 2 (PCL6) printer driver. When [Generic Model] is selected for the above models, the following functions and options are not available for printing.

■ Printing

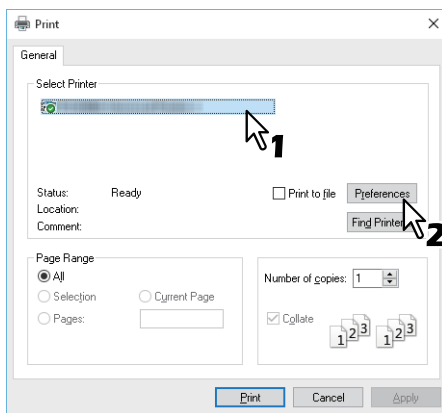
Once you have installed and configured the printer driver, you can print directly from most Windows applications by selecting [Print]. You can print using a variety of functions in the printer driver.

Tip

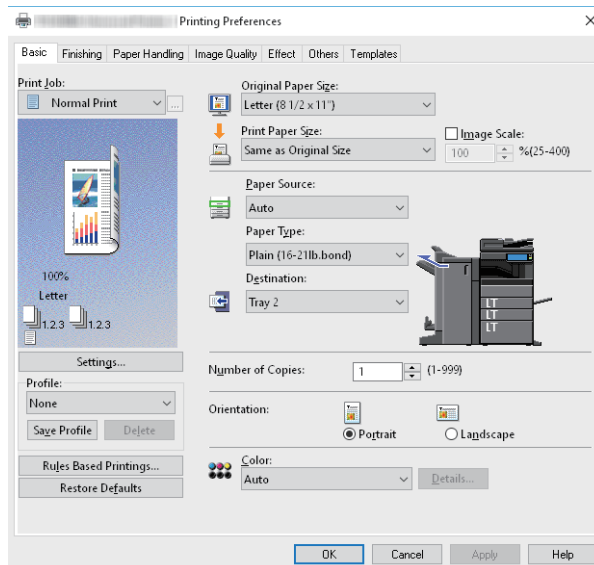
The procedure to display the properties dialog for the printer driver may differ depending on the application you are using. See your application’s manual for information on displaying the properties dialog box.

The following is an example of printing from Notepad in Windows.

- 1 Open a file, select [File], and then select [Print].
- 2 Select the printer driver for the equipment you want to use, and then click [Preferences].



- 3 Set the print options you want on each tab.

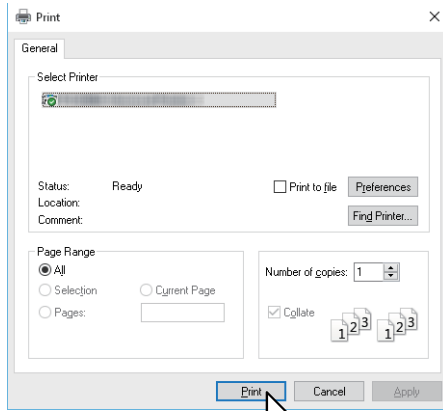


You can also set the print options using setting profiles.

❑ Entering a Department Code

When managing this equipment using counter information in department codes, you have to enter your code to print. Contact your administrator for more information.

Follow the steps below to enter the department code in advance to print without entering the code every time.

- Your administrator makes settings to manage counter information in department codes.

- You can enter your department code whenever you print. If you have to use a different department code for each print job, enter it when you begin printing.

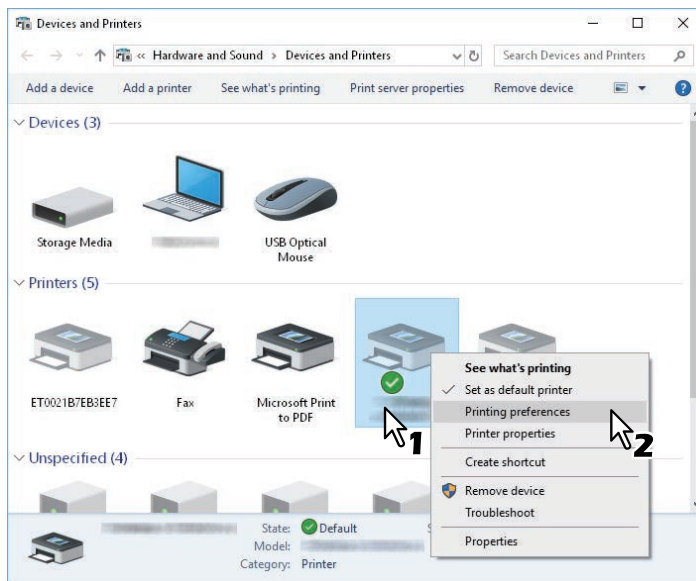
1 Click [Start] and select [Settings] > [Devices] > [Devices and printers].

The Printers folder appears.

Tip

For Windows 8.1/Windows Server 2012, right-click in the lower left of the screen, then click [Control Panel] > [View devices and printers].

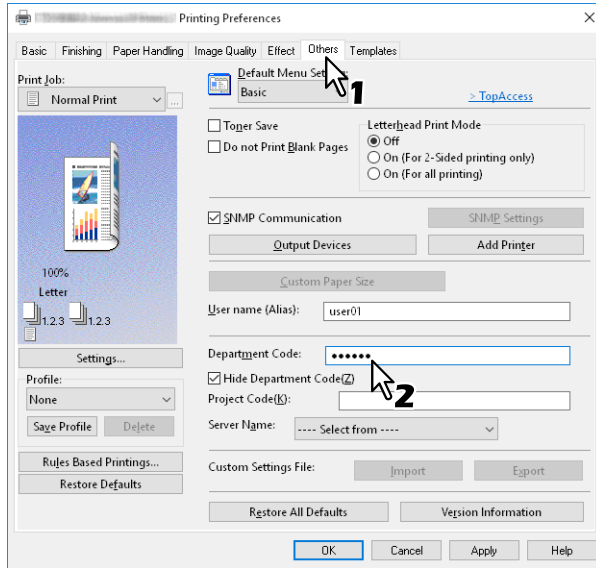
2 Right-click the printer driver of this equipment and select [Printing Preferences] from the displayed menu.



Tip

If the [File] menu is not displayed, press [Alt].

3 Display the [Others] tab menu and enter your department code in [Department Code].



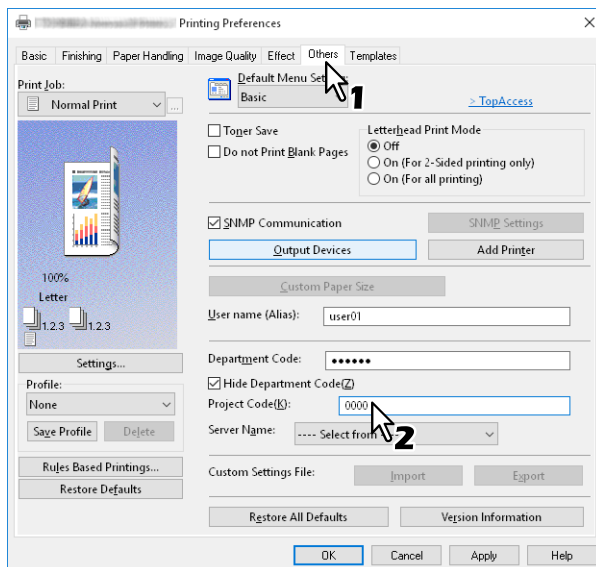
You can enter up to 63 characters.

4 Click [Apply] or [OK] to save.

❑ Entering a Project Code

You can enter a project code in advance.

1 Display the [Others] tab menu and enter your project code in [Project Code].

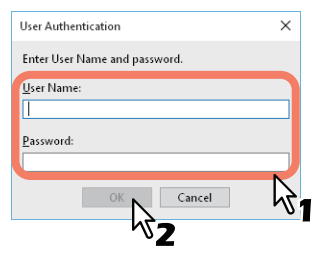


You can enter up to 63 characters. Ask your administrator for the project code.

2 Click [Apply] or [OK] to save.

❑ Entering a User Name and Password

When the User Name and Password options are enabled, you are prompted to enter your user name and password before printing a document. Enter your user name and password, and then click [OK].

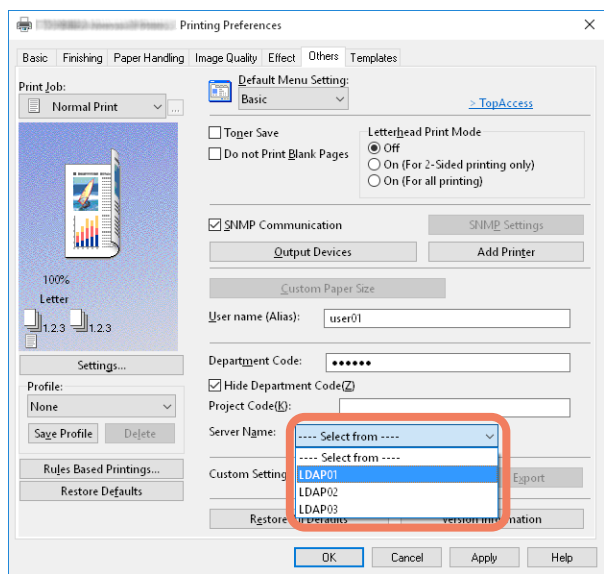


Tip

- Enter up to 128 characters in [User Name], and up to 64 characters in [Password].
- The values entered in the above boxes are not stored. You must enter them every time you print.
- You can make settings on the [Device Settings] tab.

❑ Setting the LDAP Server Name

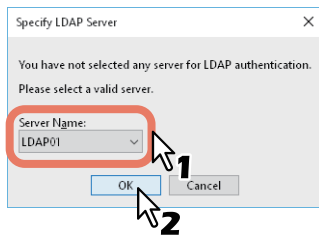
When LDAP authentication is enabled on this equipment, you must specify an LDAP server in [Server Name] on the [Others] tab.



If you send a print job without specifying an LDAP server, the [Specify LDAP Server] dialog box is displayed.




Specify the LDAP server you want to use in [Server Name], and then click [OK].



Tip

You can make settings for LDAP authentication on the [Device Settings] tab.

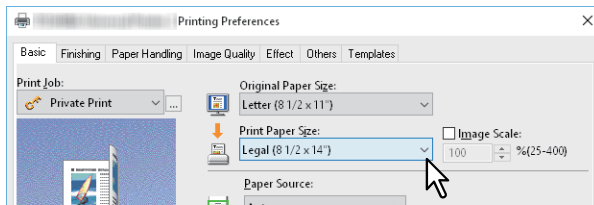

□ Setting the Paper Size

Select the size of the document to be printed.

- 1** Display the [Basic] tab menu.
- 2** Select the document size in [Original Paper Size].
- 3** Select the paper size in [Print Paper Size].

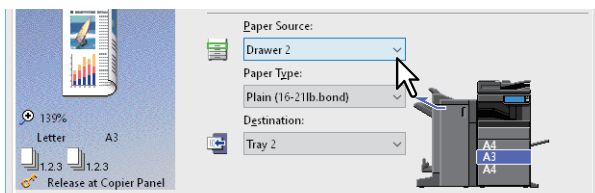


If you do not want to enable enlarged or reduced printing, select [Same as Original Size].

- 4** Set other printing functions as needed, and then click [OK].
- 5** Click [Print] or [OK] to send the job.

□ Setting the Paper Source

- 1** Display the [Basic] tab menu.
- 2** Select the paper source in [Paper Source].



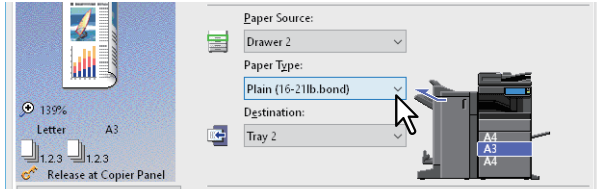
The color of the selected paper source changes in the preview area on the [Basic] tab.

- 3** Set other printing functions as needed, and then click [OK].
- 4** Click [Print] or [OK] to send the job.

❑ Setting the Paper Type

Select the paper type of the document to be printed.

- 1** Display the [Basic] tab menu.
- 2** Select the paper type in [Paper Type].



- 3** Set other printing functions as needed, and then click [OK].
- 4** Click [Print] or [OK] to send the job.

❑ Printing on tab paper

You can print on the tab extension of tab paper.

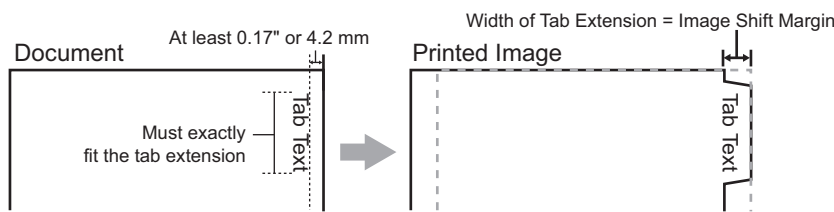
Note

- Tab printing is not available to some models.
- You can only print on Letter-sized or A4-sized paper.
- If a misprint occurs while printing multiple tab pages, dirt may adhere to the back of the paper. To avoid this, print tab paper as a separate job for each page so that this equipment performs cleaning before printing the next sheet.
- Note that tab paper may be caught in the exit tray because there is no roller to eject the tab extension. Remove the tab paper before printing the next job.

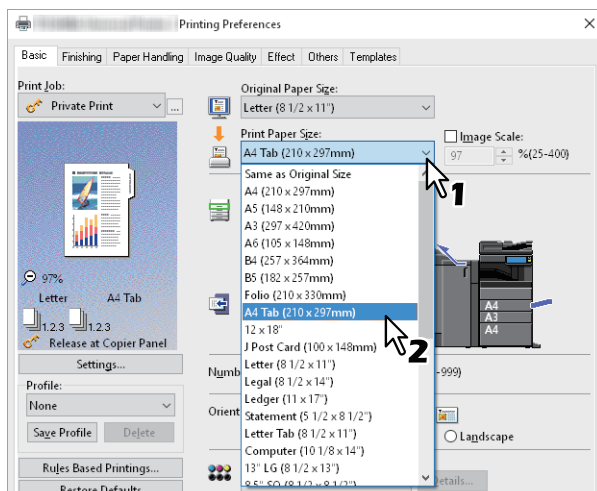
1 Create a Letter sized or A4 sized document and place the text or object on the tab extension on the right of the document as described below.

Place the text at a height that fits exactly into the tab extension.

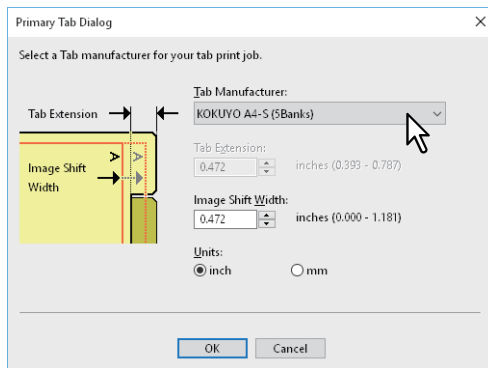
The margin between the shifted text and the right edge of the tab extension must have a space of at least 0.17 inches (4.2 mm). Enter the same value in [Tab Extension] and [Image Shift Width].



2 Display the [Basic] tab menu from printer driver properties, select the document size in [Original Paper Size] and either [Letter Tab] or [A4 Tab] (according to the document size) in [Print Paper Size].



- 3 In [Tab Manufacturer], select the product name of the tab paper, or select [Custom] if you are using a product not displayed.**



- 4 When you select [Custom], enter the width of the tab extension in [Tab Extension].**
- 5 Enter the width to shift the printed image in [Image Shift Width].**
If you created a document in Step 1, enter the width of the tab extension here.

Note

The margin between the shifted text and the right edge of the tab extension must have a space of at least 0.17 inches (4.2 mm). Enter the same value in [Tab Extension] and [Image Shift Width].

- 6 Click [OK].**
- 7 Set other printing functions as needed, and then click [OK].**
- 8 Click [Print] or [OK] to send the job.**
- 9 Place the tab paper with the tab outside.**
- 10 Press [Job Status] on the touch panel.**
- 11 Press the [START] button on the control panel.**

❑ Registering a Custom Paper Size and Printing

Follow the steps below to register a custom paper size. Define custom paper sizes on the [Others] tab and then you can use registered custom paper sizes.

Registering a custom paper size

You can register up to 40 custom paper sizes in [Custom Paper Size]. You can select the size that you specify in [Original Paper Size] and [Print Paper Size] on the [Basic] tab.

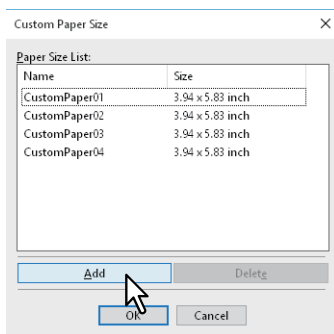
Note

- To set a [Custom Paper Size], access the Printing Preferences dialog from the [Devices and Printers] folder. You cannot make settings if you display the printer driver properties from the application's [Print] dialog box.
- You can only set the [Custom Paper Size] with administrator privilege.

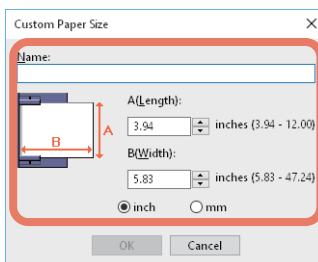
Tip

You can use the custom paper size for the Universal Printer 2 (PCL6) / Universal PS3 / Universal XPS printer drivers.

- 1 Display the [Others] tab menu.
- 2 Click [Custom Paper Size].
- 3 Click [Add].



- 4 Set the details in the [Custom Paper Size - Name] dialog box.



Name: Enter the custom paper size name. You can enter up to 31 characters. This name is displayed in [Original Paper Size] and [Print Paper Size] on the [Basic] tab.

Paper Size: Enter A (Length) and B (Width).

Units: Select the units.

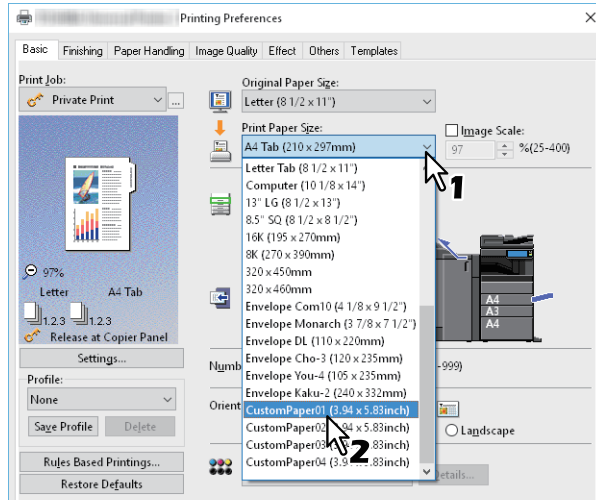
Note

- The available range of A (length) and B (width) differs depending on the model. Select values within the range shown on the right of each.
- Either A (Length) or B (Width) should differ by more than 0.3 inches (7 mm) from the standard paper size. If not, the created paper size is considered a standard paper size.
- You cannot create a paper size with A (Length) longer than B (Width). To print documents like this, select [Landscape] as the [Orientation].

- 5 Click [OK].
- 6 Check that the custom paper name is displayed in the paper size list, and then click [OK].

Printing on Custom Size Paper

- 1 Display the printer driver properties, and then select the custom paper size in [Print Paper Size] from the [Basic] tab menu.



- 2 Set other printing functions as needed, and then click [OK].
- 3 Click [Print] or [OK] to send the job.
- 4 Load the custom size paper in the bypass tray or the drawer.
- 5 Press [Job Status] on the touch panel.
- 6 Select the paper type that matches the loaded paper.
- 7 Press the [START] button on the control panel.

Tip

If there is no paper in the bypass tray or the drawer, a message is displayed on the touch panel. The paper size displayed on the touch panel may differ slightly from the paper size that you registered.

■ Enlarging and Reducing

You can automatically enlarge or reduce as an image to fit a specified paper size. You can also set the scale manually.

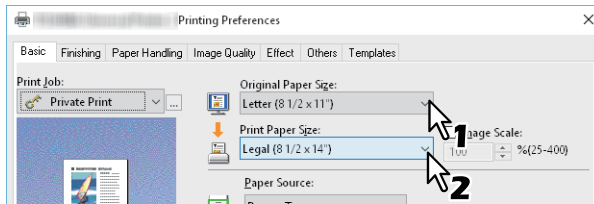

❑ Scale to fit paper size

You can automatically enlarge or reduce as an image to fit a specified paper size.

- 1** Display the [Basic] tab menu.
- 2** Select the document size in [Original Paper Size]. Select the paper size in [Print Paper Size].



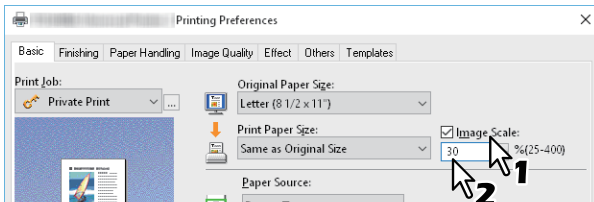
The page image is automatically enlarged or reduced depending on the selected original paper size and print paper size.

- 3** Set other printing functions as needed, and then click [OK].
- 4** Click [Print] or [OK] to send the job.

❑ Specifying a scale

Manually set the scale to enlarge or reduce the image.

- 1** Display the [Basic] tab menu.
- 2** Select [Image Scale], and then enter the scale.



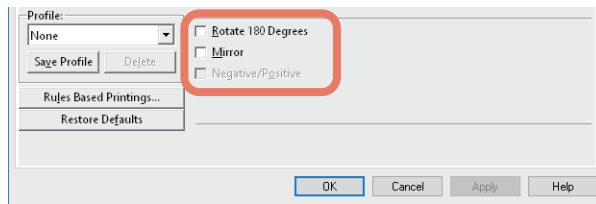
You can set from 25% to 400% in units of 1%.

- 3** Set other printing functions as needed, and then click [OK].
- 4** Click [Print] or [OK] to send the job.

■ Changing the Print Direction

Reverses the direction of ejected paper, and performs mirror printing.

- 1 Display the [Effect] tab menu.
- 2 Select the print direction check box.



Rotate 180 Degrees: Rotates an image.

Mirror: Select to perform mirror printing.

Note

This function is only available for the following printer drivers.

- Universal Printer 2 (PostScript)
- Universal XPS

Smart print for mixed size & orientation document: When the sizes and orientations (portrait and landscape) of originals are mixed, this matches the orientations of the printouts. Select this if the originals are any of the following combinations:

- A4 size portrait and A3 size landscape
- A4 size landscape and A3 size portrait
- LT size portrait and LD size landscape
- LT size landscape and LD size portrait
- B5 size portrait and B4 size landscape
- B5 size landscape and B4 size portrait
- 16K size portrait and 8K size landscape
- 16K size landscape and 8K size portrait

Note

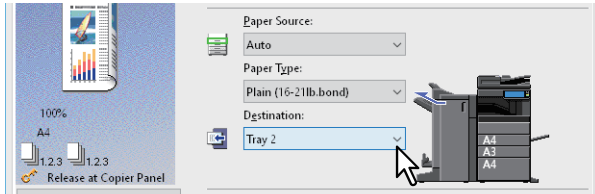
- [Smart print for mixed size & orientation document] is only available for the following printer drivers.
 - Universal Printer 2 (PCL6)
 - Universal Printer 2 (PostScript)
 - Universal PS3
- This function is not available to some models.

- 3 Set other printing functions as needed, and then click [OK].
- 4 Click [Print] or [OK] to send the job.

■ Selecting the destination tray

Selects the tray to which the print job is ejected. The current destination is indicated by an arrow in the preview area on the [Basic] tab.

- 1 Display the [Basic] tab menu.**
- 2 Select the destination tray in [Destination].**



- 3 Set other printing functions as needed, and then click [OK].**
- 4 Click [Print] or [OK] to send the job.**

Note

- Available items differ depending on the model, the paper size, and the option configuration.
- Only [Saddle Tray] is available for folded print or saddle stitch print with the Saddle Stitch Finisher installed.

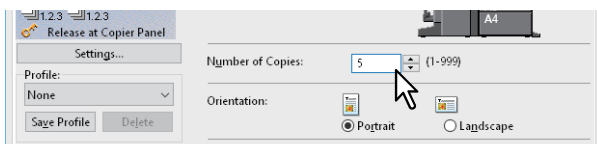
You can select how multiple copies of a document are output, such as separately for each copy, grouping each page, and alternating the paper direction for each copy.

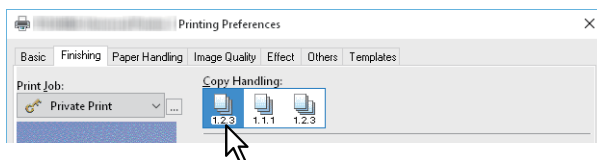
❑ Sorting printouts by copies

Select this for sort-printing (1, 2, 3...).

- 1** Display the [Basic] tab menu.
- 2** Enter the number of copies in [Number of Copies].



- 3** Display the [Finishing] tab menu.
- 4** Select the [Sort Copies] icon from [Copy Handling].

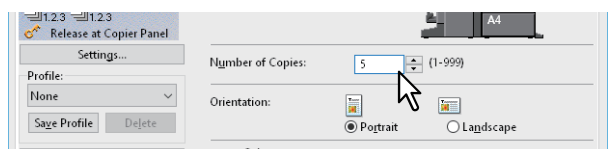


- 5** Set other printing functions as needed, and then click [OK].
- 6** Click [Print] or [OK] to send the job.
The printouts are sorted.

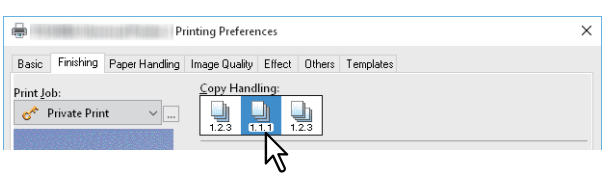
❑ **Sorting printouts by pages**

Select this for group-printing (1, 1, 1...).

- 1 Display the [Basic] tab menu.**
- 2 Enter the number of copies in [Number of Copies].**



- 3 Display the [Finishing] tab menu.**
- 4 Select the [Group Copies] icon from [Copy Handling].**



- 5 Set other printing functions as needed, and then click [OK].**
- 6 Click [Print] or [OK] to send the job.**
The printouts are sorted.

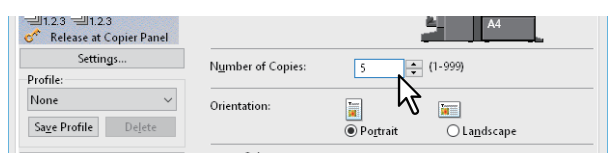
❑ **Sorting printouts horizontally and vertically**

Select this for rotate sort-printing.

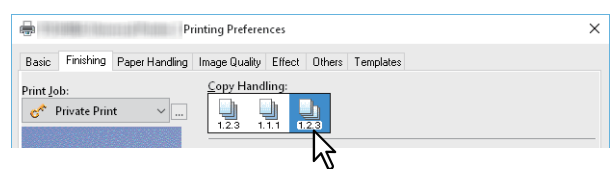
Note

- Rotated Sort Copies is not available for some models.
- Rotated Sort Copies is only available when printing on Letter, A4, B5, or 16K.
- You have to load the paper horizontally and vertically.

- 1 Display the [Basic] tab menu.**
- 2 Enter the number of copies in [Number of Copies].**



- 3 Display the [Finishing] tab menu.**
- 4 Select the [Rotated Sort Copies] icon from [Copy Handling].**

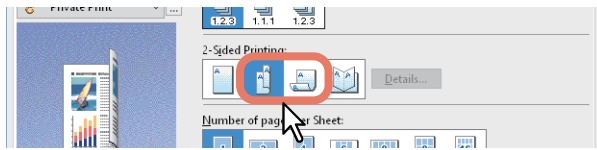


- 5 Set other printing functions as needed, and then click [OK].**
- 6 Click [Print] or [OK] to send the job.**
The printouts are sorted.

■ Printing on both sides of a sheet

You can print on both sides of the paper.

- 1 Display the [Finishing] tab menu.
- 2 Select the [2-Sided Printing] direction.



Long Edge: Select this to print on both sides of the paper with a margin on the long edge.

Short Edge: Select this to print on both sides of the paper with a margin on the short edge.

- 3 Set other printing functions as needed, and then click [OK].
- 4 Click [Print] or [OK] to send the job.

- You can also set booklet printing from the [2-Sided Printing] option by selecting the [Booklet] icon. For details on booklet printing, see the following section.

■ Making a Booklet

You can create a document in book- or magazine-style by selecting the Booklet option. You can also create a folded booklet by automatically stapling (saddle-stitching) and folding the center of a printed document. For example, if you print a document created on Letter-size paper (8½ x 11 inches), the yield is a 5½-x-8½-inch booklet. Each page is scaled to fit on half a sheet and reordered so that the booklet is correctly paginated when folded.

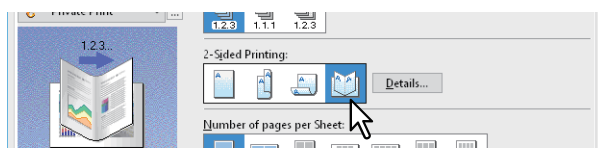
To retain your original document size when printing booklets, select the booklet size to be double the size of your original. Then your 8½-inch document is printed on Ledger size paper (11 x 17 inches) and reordered so that, when folded, the yield is an 8½-x-11-inch booklet. You can select from the following page-sizes.

- A4 Booklet on A3
- A5 Booklet on A4
- B5 Booklet on B4
- Letter Booklet on Ledger

Note

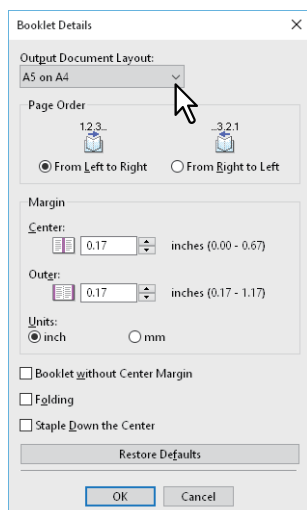
The available paper sizes vary depending on the models.

- 1 Display the [Finishing] tab menu.
- 2 Select the [Booklet] icon from [2-Sided Printing].



- 3 Click [Details].

4 Select the booklet size in [Output Document Layout].



A5 on A4: Select this to print an A5 size booklet. Every 2 pages are printed on A4 paper to fit on half a sheet (A5).

A4 on A3: Select this to print an A4 size booklet. Every 2 pages are printed on A3 paper to fit on half a sheet (A4).

B5 on B4: Select this to print a B5 size booklet. Every 2 pages are printed on B4 paper to fit on half a sheet (B5).

B6 on B5: Select this to print a B6 size booklet. Every 2 pages are printed on B5 paper to fit on half a sheet (B6).

1/2 Folio on Folio: Select this to print a 1/2 Folio size booklet. Every 2 pages are printed on Folio paper to fit on half a sheet.

A6 on A5: Select this to print an A6 size booklet. Every 2 pages are printed on A5 paper to fit on half a sheet (A6).

Letter-Half on Letter: Select this to print a 1/2 Letter size booklet. Every 2 pages are printed on Letter paper to fit on half a sheet.

LT on LD: Select this to print a Letter size booklet. Every 2 pages are printed on Ledger paper to fit on half a sheet (Letter).

1/2 LG on LG: Select this to print a 1/2 Legal size booklet. Every 2 pages are printed on Legal paper to fit on half a sheet.

1/2 Statement on Statement: Select this to print a 1/2 Statement size booklet. Every 2 pages are printed on Statement paper to fit on half a sheet.

1/2 Comp on Comp: Select this to print a 1/2 Computer size booklet. Every 2 pages are printed on Computer paper to fit on half a sheet.

1/2 13LG on 13LG: Select this to print a 1/2 13 inch LG size booklet. Every 2 pages are printed on 13 inch LG paper to fit on half a sheet.

1/2 8.5SQ on 8.5SQ: Select this to print a 1/2 8.5 inch SQ size booklet. Every 2 pages are printed on 8.5 inch SQ paper to fit on half a sheet.

32K on 16K: Select this to print an 32K size booklet. Every 2 pages are printed on 16K paper to fit on half a sheet (32K).

16K on 8K: Select this to print an 16K size booklet. Every 2 pages are printed on 8K paper to fit on half a sheet (16K).

Note

The available paper sizes vary depending on the models.

5 Select the page order for booklet from the [Page Order] option.

6 Set the margins in [Margin].

[Center]: This sets the gutter in the center of a two-sided page. You can enter up to 16.90 mm (0.67 inches). Printed images are reduced according to the margin setting.

[Outer]: This sets the gutter on the right and left of the paper. You can enter up to 29.60 mm (1.17 inches). Printed images are reduced according to the margin setting.

[Units]: This sets the unit of measurement used for the margins.

Tip

If you select [Booklet without Center Margin], the value in [Center] becomes invalid and the center margin becomes 0 mm (inches).

7 Select [Folding] to fold the document at its center.

Note

- [Folding] is only available when the Saddle Stitch Finisher is installed.
- This function is not available to some models.

8 Select [Staple Down the Center], to double-staple the center.

Note

- [Staple Down the Center] can be selected only when the Saddle Stitch Finisher is installed.
- This function is not available to some models.

9 Click [OK].

10 Set other printing functions as needed, and then click [OK].

■ Printing multiple pages per sheet

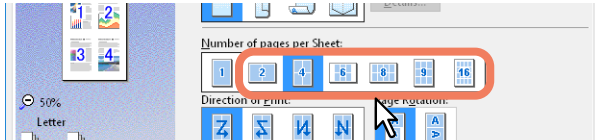
The N-up feature allows you to print several pages of a document on one sheet of paper. This feature is useful for browsing a large number of pages for appearance or page order. For example, to check the navigation path of a number of web pages or review the narrative of a slide presentation, using N-up is convenient and conserves paper.

Tip

When [Overlay Image] is selected with the N-up feature, the overlay images are printed per sheet, not per page. If you want to print on each page, select [Print on Each Page] in [Overlay Image] on the [Effect] tab.

1 Display the [Finishing] tab menu.

2 Select how many pages you want to print on a single sheet from [Number of pages per Sheet].



2 pages: Select this to print images from 2 pages on one sheet.

4 pages: Select this to print images from 4 pages on one sheet.

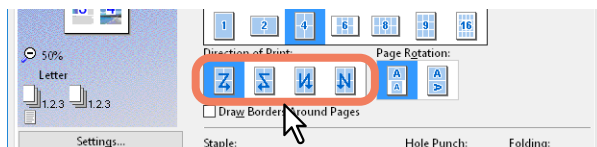
6 pages: Select this to print images from 6 pages on one sheet.

8 pages: Select this to print images from 8 pages on one sheet.

9 pages: Select this to print images from 9 pages on one sheet.

16 pages: Select this to print images from 16 pages on one sheet.

3 Select how the pages are arranged on one sheet in [Direction of Print].



Left to Right: Arranges pages horizontally from the left and printed top to bottom on one sheet.

Right to Left: Arranges pages horizontally from the right and printed top to bottom on one sheet.

Left to Right by column: Arranges pages vertically from the top and printed left to right on one sheet.

Right to Left by column: Arranges pages vertically from the top and printed right to left on one sheet.

Tip

Items available in [Direction of Print] may vary depending on the number of pages selected in [Number of pages per Sheet].

4 If you want to print an original whose orientations are mixed, select [Page Rotation].

When the orientation of the printed image is the same: Performs printing in the same orientation as that for the original while its size is reduced.

When the orientation of the sheets of paper is the same: Performs printing by rotating the printing direction by 90 degrees from the original orientation.

Note

An original whose orientations are mixed cannot be printed in some models.

5 If you want to draw a line around each page, select [Draw Borders Around Pages].

6 Set other printing functions as needed, and then click [OK].

7 Click [Print] or [OK] to send the job.

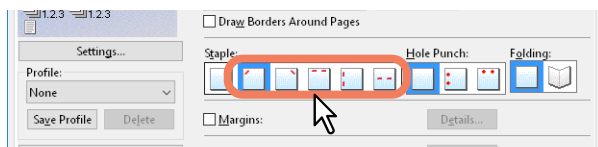
■ Stapling

You can staple sets of paper as they are ejected from the equipment.

- Staple printing is only available when the Finisher is installed.

Upper Right: Staples the document at the upper right.

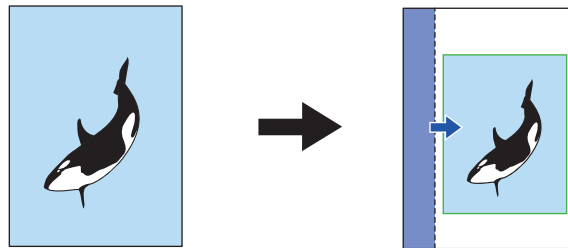

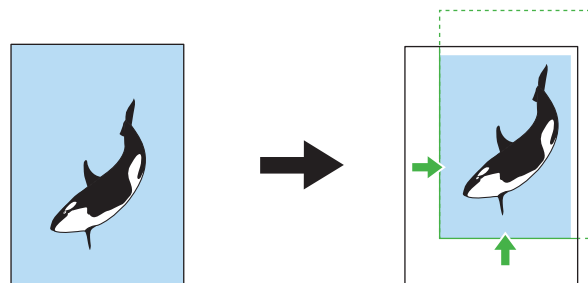

The [Multiple Overlays] dialog box is displayed when you select [Multiple Overlays] or you click [Details] after selecting an overlay in [Overlay Image]. Set which overlay image is applied to which page.



1. Overlay Images

The registered overlay images are displayed as thumbnails. Select the overlay image you want to use.

Tip

You can drag and drop an overlay image from the thumbnails to an overlay group (Master Setting 1/2 or Setting 1 to 6). If another overlay image is already set in the selected group, the overlay image is overwritten.

2. [↓] (Master Setting)

Sets the overlay image selected in [Overlay Images] in the [Master Setting] field. Every time you click this button, the selection switches in the order [Master Setting 1] to [Master Setting 2].

3. [↓] (Setting)

Sets the overlay image selected in [Overlay Images] in the [Setting] field. Every time you click this button, the selection switches in the order [Setting 1], [Setting 2], [Setting 3], [Setting 4], [Setting 5], and [Setting 6].

4. Master Setting 1/2

Sets if the selected overlay image is applied to all, even, or odd pages.

- **All:** Applies the overlay image to all pages.
- **Even:** Applies the overlay image to even pages.
- **Odd:** Applies the overlay image to odd pages.

Note

- If the pages specified by master settings overlap, [Even] or [Odd] takes priority over [All].
- If the pages specified in [Master Setting] and [Setting] overlap, [Setting] takes priority over [Master Setting].

5. Setting 1/2/3/4/5/6

Applies the overlay image to pages by page number. To specify more than one page, delimit with commas (,) such as "1, 3, 5". To specify pages in a range, use a hyphen (-) between the first and the last pages, such as "6-10".

- **Page:** Applies the overlay image to the specified pages.

Note

If the specified pages overlap among multiple settings, the newer setting takes priority.

6. Select setting to clear

Selects the overlay image setting to be cleared.

7. [Clear]

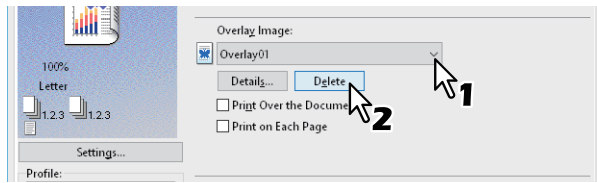

- **Hard disk:** Sets whether or not the internal storage device is installed.

■ Important Notes

- When User Management is enabled, it is used to manage print jobs instead of the Department Code Management setting. In this case, that user name that was entered to log in to your computer is used to authenticate the print job. Therefore, you do not need to set your department code to the printer driver but you must register your user name in advance. If your user name is not registered, the print job is processed as an invalid job according to the User Authentication Enforcement setting. Also, print jobs sent in RAW format are processed according to the RAW Print Job setting.

When Windows Domain Authentication is used for the User Management Setting, your computer must log in to the domain.

- If the No Limit Black function is enabled, you can only perform department management for Color. When [Auto], [Color], or [Twin Color] are selected from [Color] on the [Basic] tab, you need to enter your department code. When [Black and White] is selected, you do not have to specify the department code.
- You can set some print options, such as collation, from the application and the printer driver. If collation is set from the application, documents may not be printed correctly. If that happens, use the printer driver to set the collation mode. Depending on the application, some print options, such as the orientation, need to be set from the application. For print options that can be set from both the application and the driver, see the manual supplied with the application.

Notes when using the Universal PS3 printer driver

- When printing from Adobe Acrobat, the print function for selecting the paper source matching the PDF page size is disabled even if it has been selected. If you want to use PostScript with this function, use the Universal Printer 2 printer driver, click [Customization] on the [Device Settings] tab, and then select [PostScript] in [Output PDL] on the [PDL Settings] tab.
